My dear Dr. Wylde,

You know that at Macdonald College we have established an Institute of Parasitology, and one matter that concerns us is the scarcity of literature in our Library there.

I have asked Professor Conklin to see you and Professor Simpson to discuss what can be done for the loan from our Medical Library of suitable works, journals, etc. to Macdonald.

Dr. John Todd, formerly on our staff, is on the Committee out there, and in discussing this matter at a meeting, he ventured the opinion that his library, which he gave to McGill, would probably be of more use out there than here just now. If that is so, it might be transferred on permanent loan to the Institute of Parasitology at Macdonald, and such volumes re-loaned to the Medical Library as may from time to time be required.

I am bespeaking for the Institute a favourable measure of co-operation on the part of the Medical Library here.
