PARTICULAR attention should be paid to the milking of cows. Children should never be trusted with this business, and there are many grown people who never milk well, though they have been brought up to the business. If you would obtain all the milk from the cow, you must treat her with the utmost gentleness; she must not stand trembling under your blows or threats. After the bag has been brushed, and the ends of the teats been moistened, the milk must be drawn speedily, or you will not get the whole. You must not sit and talk—you must not delay one moment, if you would have all the milk she is ready to give. A careful and expeditious milker will obtain more milk from a cow, especially if it be the person who has been in the habit of milking her, than a slow careless milker. If farmers would consider the much greater quantity of milk a cow will yield in a season that is in good condition in the Spring, than one that has "been on the lift," we are confident there would not be so many skeleton cows on our farms as there now are.
