Next day was devoted to a levee at the Government House, where the most distinguished gentlemen of the island were presented to the Prince, and to a public ball in the Province Building, which was fully attended, and where the Prince danced with vigor and interest in nearly every set. The time set apart for his journey did not allow him to make any progress through the island; and accordingly, on the morning of the 11th, he was escorted as on the day of his arrival, to the landing-place, where he embarked in the Hero for Gaspee and the St. Lawrence.
