An Act to admit vessels registered in the United States to wrecking, towing and coasting privileges in Canadian waters.

HER Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

- 1. United States vessels of all descriptions may render aid U. S. vessels 5 and assistance to any and all vessels, of whatsoever nationality, may render aid in Canadian waters.

 The descriptions may render aid u. S. vessels and assistance to any and all vessels, of whatsoever nationality, may render aid in Canadian waters.
- 2. United States steam vessels may tow any ship, vessel, or U. S. steam raft, of whatsoever nationality, from one port or place in Canada vessels may tow between to another, subject only to such dues and regulations as Canaplaces in Canada.
- 3. United States vessels or ships are hereby admitted to the Coasting pricoasting trade of Canada, and are authorized to carry goods and vilege granted passengers from one port or place in Canada to another, subsels. ject only to such dues or regulations as Canadian ships are 15 subject to.
 - 4. This Act shall take effect as soon as and remain in force Commenceso long as the like privileges of wrecking, towing and coasting ment and durin United States waters are extended to Canadian vessels by the Government of the United States.
