**BILL.**

An Act to admit vessels registered in the United States to wrecking, towing and coasting privileges in Canadian waters.

**H**ER Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows :—

1. United States vessels of all descriptions may render aid  
5 and assistance to any and all vessels, of whatsoever nationality,  
wrecked or disabled in Canadian waters. U. S. vessels  
may render  
aid in Cana-  
dian waters.
2. United States steam vessels may tow any ship, vessel, or  
raft, of whatsoever nationality, from one port or place in Canada  
to another, subject only to such dues and regulations as Cana-  
10 dian ships are subject to. U. S. steam  
vessels may  
tow between  
places in  
Canada.
3. United States vessels or ships are hereby admitted to the  
coasting trade of Canada, and are authorized to carry goods and  
passengers from one port or place in Canada to another, sub-  
ject only to such dues or regulations as Canadian ships are  
15 subject to. Coasting pri-  
vilege granted  
to U. S. ves-  
sels.
4. This Act shall take effect as soon as and remain in force  
so long as the like privileges of wrecking, towing and coasting  
in United States waters are extended to Canadian vessels by  
the Government of the United States. Commence-  
ment and dur-  
ation of Act.
