of a monthly magazine or paper which might afford the desired help to teachers, serve as a medium of intercommunion among them, and, at the same time advocate, among the people at large, the claims of our Sunday School work.

Your Committee would again most respectfully, yet strongly, urge upon the Conference the importance of at once carrying out the provisions of the discipline for the organization of a Wesleyan Sunday School Union, believing that such a course would give a much needed impetus to the Subbath School enterprise, greatly strengthen the connexional spirit, and vastly increase the efficiency of this important department of the Church's work.

Your Committee would also recommend that efforts be in de in every part of the Connexion, to increase the interest of our people in Sunday School matters by holding District Sunday School Conventions, in which, by the free interchange of views, our Teachers might aid each other in the discharge of their important duties. They would further recommend that this subject be brought up for consideration at the Financial District Meetings, and that, if practicable, arrangements be made for holding such conventions during the month of October.
