The chief demand for stocks seemed to arise from the short interest, and buying from that side of the market was largely responsible for the opening advance, in which a number of important issues gained from one to two points. The demand at a higher level was so limited that the market gradually fell back. During the day there were several small movements, arising usually from efforts of bear traders to bring on a renewal of the decline, but they netted so little that the session ended with only a few changes of importance.
