No Chance for Sunday Baseball in Maryland

Annapolis, Md., March 30.—The Sunday baseball bill, by a vote of 50 to 37, was laid on the table in the lower house of the Maryland Legislature this afternoon. This kills all hope for legalizing Sunday baseball in this state for at least two years, as the legislature adjourns sine die on Monday next. The bill had already passed the state senate, but the pressure of organized reform elements was too great for advocates of a liberal Sunday to overcome.

PARI-MUTUELS ARE POPULAR ON NEW ZEALAND RACE TRACKS.

The totalizator, which is the New Zealand term for the pari-mutuel betting machine, is in use on the race tracks there, and recently several records were broken in the amount of money handled, for, despite the war, the horse racing sport is enjoying great popularity. On Auckland Cup day the turnover amounted to \$404,925, which broke all records. Under the New Zealand system the horsemen share in the profits from the machines.

REFeree DECIDES IN HEAVYWEIGHT TILT

If There is no K.O. in Bout Between Willard and Fulton.

The agreement between Jess Willard and Fred Fulton to fight for the heavyweight championship calls for a battle to a referee's decision. If there is no K.O. in the first and separate agreement that Mike Collins, Fulton's manager, signed with C. E. Miller, promoter of the match, in Kansas City at their first meeting, it is to the effect that, no matter what the length of the contest or its location geographically, there must be a referee's decision rendered at the finish of the contest, whether that finish comes with a knockout or if the men are both on their feet at the end of the announced limit. It is true that there is nothing said about this in the agreement signed in Chicago last week. But, according to Mike Collins, this latter document in no way invalidates his personal agreement signed in Kansas City with C. E. Miller, which is supported by forfeits of \$1000 each. At least, so Mike understands it and so will he insist upon it. This we find that should the men accept an offer to box only eight rounds in New Jersey, there must be a referee's decision if the men are on their feet when the bell tolls the end of the eighth round. The same is true of a 10-round encounter in Minnesota, a 12 or a 15-round contest in New England, or a 20-round battle in Colorado. The referee was asked about this part of the agreement the other day and seemed a little surprised to learn of the clause in the Collins contract, which he had never seen. "I told Miller to go ahead and do just what he thought was for the best of all hands," the champion said. "The decision part of it is important, of course, but it really makes no difference to me. I can beat him in one or 20 rounds and I am not afraid of a referee's decision. The trick will be to get a referee of nerve and judgment."
