HAMILTON HAPPENINGS

Edna Meyers in Critical Condition - Hospital Patients Give Flesh for Grafting Operation.

Hamilton, Aug. 26.-(Special.)-An appalling accident took place near Ryckman's Corners, about four miles from here, on Saturday afternoon, when Edna Myers, nine years old, had her scalp and a portion of her cheek torn off as a result of her hair becoming entwined around the shaft of a windmill. The youngster was playing about a barn on the farm on which her father worked and got too near the shaft which was revolving at a high rate of speed, when, her hair catching, she was suspended in the air. Her cries brought assistance, and after being taken from her perilous position she was brought to the city hospital where Dr. Cummings performed an operation on her in an endeavor to graft the flesh on. The child's father and several of the patients in the hospital consented to have flesh taken from their bodies for the purpose of grafting. The youngster's condition is serious, but it is possible that she may recover. At any rate it is expected she will linger for some time.
