Friday Evening, March 19. Liverpool wheat futures 1/4 higher. Corn 1/4 to 1/2 higher. Cash wheat in Chicago 1/2 higher at 74c. May wheat on curb 75c. Put on May wheat 74 1/2 to 75c.

Cattle receipts at Chicago to-day, 3500; market steady to strong. Estimated receipts of hogs at Chicago to-day, 19,000; official Thursday, 23,000; left over, 1500. Estimated for Saturday, 13,000; market quiet and 5c to 10c higher. Heavy shippers, \$7.70 to \$4.15.

Receipts of wheat at Liverpool to-day, 23,000; market quiet and 5c to 10c higher. Receipts of wheat at Montreal to-day, 23,000; market quiet and 5c to 10c higher.

Receipts of grain at Chicago to-day: Wheat, 20,000; corn, 10,000; oats, 10,000. Estimated receipts of grain at Chicago to-day, 20,000; market quiet and 5c to 10c higher.
