Consols declined 5-16 in Landon, the Paris bourse was weak, and a cable from Berlin read: "Prices opened firm on the boerse to-day, due to the statement of The Dally Graphic of London that Major (Marchand is to return to Fashoda and then to withdraw his expedition in the direction of the Upper Ubangps Miver, north of the Congo, thus evacuating Fashoda and then two posts established by him east of the frontier, indicated in the Anglo-German agreement. But, subsequently, prices weakened in response to the weakness of western bourses. Bank shares were firm."
