Miss Heaton said she had married the doctor nine years ago. Dr. Towner had graduated from Toronto College of Medicine, and, coming to Detroit, had built up a large practice. Overwork drove him to take drugs for stimulants, and from bad to worse he had gone every year, Last winter they lived at 58 Grand River-avenue, and a little practice came to the ruled man. Later they had lived at 135 Cass-street. The doctor did nothing but eat drugs, and his wife had to work. For some two years she had supported herself by factory work, a strange contrast to her former easy life. To shield her husband, she worked under an assumed name, calling herself by her husband's middle name, "Heaton." Her employers knew of her wedded life, and aided her in covering up her identity.
