members of the government and representatives of the Maritime Provinces. The basis of Confederation was agreed upon; and in a few years the little Canada in which Oliver Mowat spent his early years had become a great country, stretching from the Atlantic to the Pacific and comprising an area as large as that of the United States.

In November, 1884, Mr. Mowat retired from politics for a time, but he had not even begun his long political career by which he has become known to the world. In 1872 Edward Blake, having defeated Sandfield Macdonald and formed a new ministry in the Federal arena, the successor he wanted was Oliver Mowat and Mowat stepped into the breach and once more entered into the strife of politics.

These questions being settled, the battle ground was shifted to the Maritime Provinces. The charge was made that the government had made amendments to the law, which would separate the Maritime Provinces from the rest of Canada.

Continued From Page 1. A mere fringe of settlement along the St. Lawrence and the lower lakes. Back from the towns where the lawyers bar just about the time that the union was consummated; and all thru the period of the struggle.

Under His Great Chief. A reform government was formed under Lafontaine and Baldwin. On the 1st of July, 1841, the union of the two provinces was consummated.

Stormy Political Period. In the year following Mr. Mowat's entry into parliament occurred the incident known as the double shuffle.

His Personal Life. Under the leadership of the late Lieut.-Governor Mowat, the government referred the question to the Queen, who decided in favor of Ottawa.
