How Will France Accept Germany's Morocco Policy?

Paris, June 9.—Germany's note to the powers, proposing an international conference on the subject of Morocco, is regarded in the highest quarters as renewing the gravity of the situation almost to the point of making it menacing. France has received a copy of the note showing that Germany acted openly in appealing to the powers, notwithstanding the official statement from Berlin that Morocco involves no conference. The officials here interpret the German note as showing that Germany is the real upholder of the con-
