TRUSTEES WANT NELSON ST. CLOSED

Hospital Trust Held Its Regular Meeting Yesterday Afternoon.

A meeting of the hospital trust was held yesterday afternoon in the mayor's office. Those present were: S. S. Searson (chairman), Mayor Judd, C. M. R. Graham, G. B. Harris, R. W. Jackson and Supt. Heard.

It was decided to make an application to the council to have Nelson street closed from Colborne street to Waterloo street. At present the street forms part of the hospital grounds, and the traffic on it is a nuisance.

FOREST OF GUM TREES

California Man Sees Great Chance for Profit in Scheme.

Los Angeles, Cal., Sept. 13. — There has developed throughout southern California renewed interest in the planting of eucalyptus trees for commercial purposes. It is said by those who have kept in close touch with the situation that several million young trees will be planted during the ensuing year.

George B. Southard or Riverdale declares that within a few years the timber industry will be quite as important as the raising of citrus fruits. Mr. Southard will plant 100,000 young trees next spring. These will be sugar, red and blue gums, varieties suitable for fuel, telegraph poles, and railroad ties.

The Santa Fe has made good progress on its eucalyptus ranch in San Diego county, and the success of the Whiting forests, near El Toro, is well known.

One of the latest movements for the development of this timber industry is the formation of the Eucalyptus Timber Company of this city, with a capital of \$50,000. W. S. Thatcher is president. This company, which has just established offices at No. 149 South Broadway, has purchased 1,800 acres of land in Tulare county, and planted red gums on every acre. The planting will be begun in February, after the ground has become well saturated from the winter rains.

Nursery headquarters are to be maintained at Greening Station, between Los Angeles and Whittier. At that point there are now growing more than 600,000 young red gum trees, and in addition, the company has purchased 1,250,000 trees of the same variety. Growths made in Tulare county, on small ranches, have proven that the conditions there for the rapid development of the trees are excellent. Seventy year old trees now measure twenty inches in diameter and are being cut for telephone poles and domestic uses.

BORDEN AT WOODSTOCK

Opposition Leader Presents His Platform to the Oxford Electors.

Woodstock, Sept. 13.—Mr. R. L. Borden, the Conservative leader, addressed a large audience here this evening. There was the usual parade from the station with brass bands, etc.

The meeting took place early in the afternoon. The Opposition leader stuck pretty much to the lines he has been speaking along since starting his tour. The Halifax platform was once more propounded, but while given the closest attention it did not appear to arouse any great enthusiasm. He made the usual attack on the Government, accusing it of all the sins on the calendar, reserving for his party all the virtues. Other speakers were Messrs. Blain, M. P. Cock-shutt and Mr. Dan. Smith.

TREATY NOT SIGNED

London, Sept. 13.—Mr. Fielding who has been in London for a week on business connected with the Franco-Canadian treaty, has returned to Paris. Asked about the treaty negotiations, he replied that although they were progressing favorably, they were not closed, and therefore he was not free to make any statement as to the terms proposed in the new agreement. The statement that had appeared in the press purporting to give the lines of the treaty were, he said, unauthorized and inaccurate.

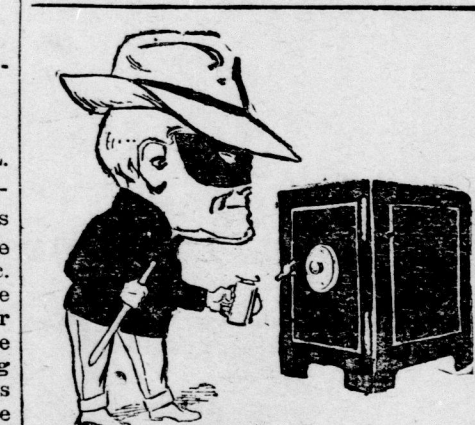
