London's million-dollar hotel project s progressing favorably. This, however, is all Mr. George M. Reid, head of the Chamber of Commerce committee, which has the matter in hand, would say today. The committee met Tuesday afternoon, and it is practically understood that the project will be carried through in the near future. Mr. Reid stated that nothing would be definitely decided until at least \$250,000 has been subscribed, and this amount has not yet been reached.

A number of sites are under consideration. It is not likely that the hotel will be built further north than Fullerton street. Among the sites under consideration, it is understood, is the property on Richmond street, running westward, between Fullarton street and Queen's avenue. 
