MONTREAL, April 4.—The railway earnings for the last ten days in March are the most discouraging that have been recorded for any period since the depression in trade began to manifest itself towards the end of last year.

As compared with the same period in 1907, the combined fall of the Canadian Pacific and Grand Trunk amounts to over half a million dollars, and the combined fall of the Canadian Pacific and Grand Trunk amounts to over half a million dollars.

The shrinkage is apparent in both passenger and freight receipts. The proportion in which the loss is distributed is not towards the end of the month, but towards the beginning.

The immediate prospect of improvement is not regarded as hopeful. Nearly all the wheat has been moved out of the west, and the quantity of merchandise and manufacturers' supplies going into the west is much less than a year ago.

Meanwhile the railways are looking to further economize, and a ten per cent. reduction in salaries and wages from the highest to the lowest has been practically resolved upon by the Canadian Pacific, and this will be followed by similar action on the Grand Trunk.
