AGENCY.

During the year the Agents have been labouring with their accustomed fidelity and diligence. It can easily be believed that during the past winter, marked as it was by many and most severe snow storms, their difficulties were very great in making their way from one Branch to another. With very few exceptions, however, they were enabled to meet all their appointments, although this required much perseverance and self denial. During part of the winter months, by an arrangement sanctioned by the Directors, Mr. Taylor, the senior Agent had his place supplied by a substitute, the Rev. Mr. Kennedy, while he was engaged, in response to calls addressed to him, in delivering a series of Lectures on Palestine, Egypt and the other localities lately visited by him. It is with very deep regret that the Directors have to announce that Mr. Taylor has felt it to be his duty to tender his resignation, for a time at least, of the Office of Agent, that he may be enabled to respond to the numerous invitations still addressed to him, to deliver Lectures on the
