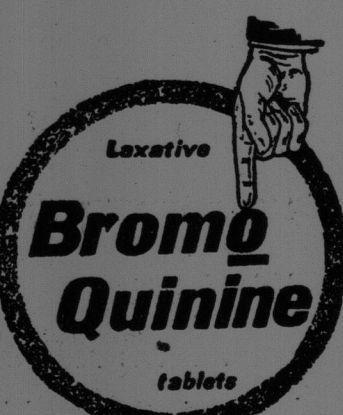

CIVIC OWNERSHIP A GREAT SUCCESS

(From "Overseas," October, 1922.) "Nowadays cheap jibes at municipal-owned undertakings are very popular and we are told that the private-owned ones are the only ones which are efficiently managed. The recent report of the Glasgow City Council concerning its ownership and management of its huge tramway undertaking, affords very remarkable reading.

"In 1924 the Glasgow City Council bought out a private undertaking and in twenty-eight years it has achieved the following results:

"All the money borrowed to pay the original owners has been paid off, together with interest. The tramway undertaking, considerably enlarged, and valued at ten million pounds (approximately \$60,000,000) is now the absolute property of the people of Glasgow, without a penny of debt. The undertaking has paid £15,000,000 in rates, £600,000 in income tax, and £1,147,000 has gone to the 'Common Good Fund.' In addition, fares are cheaper and working conditions and hours have been considerably improved.

"Certainly the City Fathers of Glasgow deserve the congratulations of the community in their wonderful achievement."

"In view of the present very critical financial condition of the agricultural industry in Canada, and due to the fact that the mortgage and loan companies, and also the banks, refuse to loan money and take real estate as security, the farmers are unable to raise sufficient money to pay their bills, which in turn makes it impossible for the business men, who are their creditors, to meet their financial obligations.

"Therefore, be it resolved, that we request the federal government to grant loans to farmers, and others, who can give good security, same to be repaid on amortized plan similar to soldier settlement loans, at a low rate of interest. And that a copy of this resolution be mailed to the premier of Canada and to the federal minister of agriculture."
