



All Ready for Mexico "If" They Sell Out for Cash. A young

HALTS MENNONITE TREK

Sell Out for Cash. Winnipeg, May 31—The Mennonites are all prepared to go to Mexico, but there is a large "if" which is causing them delay. They want cash for their and and chattels, according to three elders of the Hague, Saskatchewan, tils-—J. P. Wal, Benjamin Coertzu and Peter Wiens—now in Winnipeg. They insist upon a minimum payment of \$45 an acre for the \$0,00 acres that are situated in one large block between situated in one large block between Saskatoon and Prince Albert. They also want cash for 2,350 horses, 800 cows, 600 wagons, and a long list of farm im-plements, including fourteen tractors. The payment on the land alone would require immediate disbursement by the purchasers of \$7,200,000. A contract,' it is stated, has been made with a United States railway for the Mexico.

(Canadian Press Despatch) Ottawa, May 30-Estimates of the de-partment of immigration and coloniza-tion which passed in the house with lit-tle discussion today were: \$370,000 for contingencies in immigration agencies; \$90,000 for exhibitions; \$3,190 for the 590,000 for exhibitions; \$3,190 for the mperial institute; \$32,000 for Chinese mmigration (enforcing the exclusion or-ler at certain Pacific ports); \$6,000 for relief of distressed nationals outside of Canada, and \$15,000 for work on St. John mmigration buildings.




