

Prince Joachim Was Expelled

Story of the Arrest of Ex-Kaiser's Son in Munich—Called Sergeant a Liar

Munich, March 5.—This is the story of the arrest of Prince Joachim at a hotel here, as related by a man familiar with the circumstances:

The prince was discovered at a writing table, with the princess seated in an armchair nearby, reading a novel. "I presume you are Herr Joachim of Hohenzollern," said the spokesman of the party sent to arrest him in connection with the alleged royalist plot.

The prince eyed the soldiers a little contemptuously, and then said: "I suppose that is my name in new Germany. What do you want?"

"We have come," replied the leader of the soldiers, "to arrest you for complicity in the reactionary plot."

"That's a lie," retorted the prince, while the princess burst into tears.

"Don't ill-treat my husband!" she pleaded. Whereupon the sergeant of the revolutionary soldiers replied quietly: "Madame, we do not do things the way they were done when your father-in-law ruled Germany."

The princess, a pretty woman, dried her tears when she learned that the soldiers were not going to take her husband away. The prince was merely required to give his word as a gentleman to consider himself under restraint.

He was required to repeat after the sergeant the following pledge:

"I, Joachim Hohenzollern, consider myself under arrest, and give my word of honor not to escape from my bed room in this hotel."

Even this nominal arrest unnerved the prince. He could not sleep that night and went out into the hotel corridor to discuss with soldiers the political situation. Then, toward dawn, he telephoned to the Prussian Legation to protest, as a Prussian, against his arrest. The official there is said to have replied sharply that the Bavarian minister was asleep and could not be disturbed.

"Ah," retorted the prince, "what a different tone you would have adopted six months ago."

The prince and princess were expelled from Bavaria later in the day.

Y. M. C. A. ASKED TO EXTEND WORK

Secretary Mott Outlines World Programme to be Undertaken in Response to Nations' Appeals

Boston, March 6.—Dr. John R. Mott, general secretary of the National War Work Council of the International Committee, Young Men's Christian Association, outlined in Boston the world programme of the association to be undertaken in response to official requests of the score or more of foreign nations which have come into contact with the Y. M. C. A. in the great war. Nearly 2,000 business men of New England gathered at the Boston City Club to hear the outlining of the association's activities.

The new programme has been started, Dr. Mott explained, by the enlargement of the executive council of eight members of the international committee to 100 members from the United States and Canada. A delegation of American business men and secretarial representatives of the Y. M. C. A. is already en route to the Balkans and the Near East to study the needs as a result of requests for the establishment of civilian Red Triangle work from Greece, Serbia, Rumania and Bulgaria.

The programme for establishing the American Y. M. C. A. in France has been set in motion under the supervision of the French War Department. King Victor Emmanuel of Italy has requested the American Y. M. C. A. to continue its work there, and 300 American secretaries are now in service in that country. In all Russian territory not under the control of the Bolsheviks, the American Y. M. C. A. is serving civilians and soldiers, operating from bases at Archangel, as well as from Vladivostok in Siberia. The personnel of the Y. M. C. A. in Russia and Siberia is larger than the entire diplomatic corps of the United States and the representatives of other relief organizations there combined.

Requests for Y. M. C. A. organizations have been received from President Miksa of the New Czechoslovak Republic and from Poland. In India, Ceylon, Mesopotamia, Persia, Egypt and Turkey the work will be continued and enlarged upon, while extensions of the organization are being sought in all the South American countries, Dr. Mott said. PROGRESS OF PLANS FOR HARBOR COMMISSION

Ottawa, March 5.—Mayor Hayes and Harbor Commissioner Bullock, with R. W. Wigmore, M. P., expect to reach tomorrow a satisfactory agreement with Hon. Messrs. Carvell and Macdonald, acting for the government, in regard to the taking over of St. John harbor.

"Negotiations have been proceeding satisfactorily," said Mayor Hayes to your correspondent today, "although we can hardly confirm as yet the published statement that the government has agreed to pay something like \$2,225,000 for the city's capital investment in the harbor. We are getting a few further details today from St. John, which the ministers have asked for. We confer again tomorrow morning and we hope to agree on the whole matter then. The agreement will, of course, have to be ratified by legislation at this session of parliament."

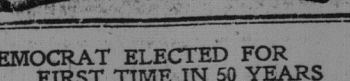
