Ottawa, Ont., May 25—In the course of a week or ten days the department of public works will call for tenders for extensive improvements in the harbor at St. John, N. B., for which the plans are about completed. In addition to extensive indeeding of Courtenay Bay, the plans include a dry dock of the first class and a ship repairing plant, and the construction of the steamers to be run in connection with the Grand Trunk Pacific.

The department likewise proposes to ask for tenders for the construction of additional wharf accommodation at Champlain market, Quebec, to be used in connection with the transportation of goods over the office of the proposed waterway from Winnipeg to Edmonton. 


