A magnificent performance was accomplished by the mile amateur champion, Kibbey, who ran through a field of over 100 runners on the Paddington track at London, on August 17, and covered the full mile in 4 min. 23 sec.

CELEBRATED.

"Joey" Darby, the champion distance runner of the world, was the principal attraction at a Free Gardeners' Race held on August 11th, and jumped against the world's three-minute record (2:13 1/2) He accomplished it in 3.1 in. He also jumped against the four jumps record (2:13 1/2) in 4.1 in. He was the champion of America, and accomplished 60 ft. in 1.4 in. The champion then jumped against the ten jumps record (1:30 1/2 in.), which he completely smashed by doing the extraordinary distance of 137 ft. 7 in. thus beating the record by 17 ft. 4 in. Darby afterwards gave several performances, including a jump off a brick end (up over a fence, with a running start) and a brick down, a feat which is decidedly novel.
