A POTENT QUERY.

An Eloquent Colored Orator Discusses a Subject of Import.

"Is There a Race Problem?" He Asks and He Solves His Own Riddle.

The following is a verbatim report of the eloquent address of Rev. R. F. Brown, Thaxby, known as the colored voice of America, on the occasion of the recent Emancipation Day celebration, which was sooted especially for the Planet.

Is there a race problem? If so, in what does it consist? Where shall we look for the solution? What is the outlook touching the final adjustment of all conflicting conditions?

"Is there a race problem?" The formulation of this question purposely suggests at the very threshold of our discussion of the subject proposed for your consideration at this time, a brief analysis of certain words in popular use in connection with its discussion and upon this analysis will depend somewhat our answer to the question just submitted, "Is there a race problem?"

By race we mean a class of individuals sprung from a common stock; the descendants collectively of a common ancestor; a family, tribe, nation or people belonging or supposed to belong to the same stock.

With this definition before us we are prepared to say there is a race problem; all problems of human interest are racial. Problems have multiplied upon the human race since the days of Eden's great catastrophe; these have been physical, moral, civil, social, religious and political.

All through the ages these problems have arisen giving rise to decisions, agitation and even division, until today you see the human race divided and subdivided, according to the multitudinous and multifarious aspects in which each problem has been viewed by those immediately concerned.

In all the periods of the world's history some have been right, and some have been wrong. But problems have multiplied and become more problematic as the race has increased in numbers and multiplied its divisions; and yet there is a fact that is too often overlooked, when dealing with the so-called problems of recent origin, and that is this: that all the problems of today are traceable to conditions that existed, and which have been existing, from the distant past, and which have been existing far back in the history of the human family. Hence we are sometimes deceived into the belief that we are dealing with the problem when in fact we are only dealing with the effect of the unsolved conditions that existed in the distant past, and which have been existing far back in the history of the human family. But the question is founded in our opening is suggested by a condition that has agitated and still agitates not only the thinking mind of the United States, but of the civilized world. A condition that has forced itself upon the thoughtful and noble hearted of all men, and which has been existing far back in the history of the human family. This condition has given rise to what is called "The Race Problem." And when I ask "Is there a race problem?" I am understood as having reference to this particular condition, and touching this question, therefore, I take the position that what we call the race problem is not a race problem, but an "inter-racial problem" that is, if it is a race problem at all, it is an "inter-racial" because it deals with the attitude of the two races toward each other.

Of course when I speak of two races, I am in harmony with the popular idea, but I have already indicated my view on that point. We must grant that there is an "inter-racial" problem, and this analysis brings it before us in its latest and most significant form. Yes, there is an "inter-racial" problem.

Let us inquire in the next place, in what does this problem consist? It evidently consists in the inability of the representatives of the two races to recognize, concede and respect the civil, social and political rights of each other. The first thing we do is to proceed to set up two separate and distinct races, and then proceed to the discussion of distinct and separate rights for each. This process obscures the identity of interest, and diverts the attention from the consideration of that interdependence upon the proper recognition of which rests the well being of all, and then we add criminality to crime by drawing a similar line in "citizenship," which necessitates the establishment of special rights and privileges, when each proceeds to define rights, and grant privileges for the other; thus, problems multiply and become more problematic, and the inevitable conflict comes, and then we undertake to adjust the whole thing by deciding what one imaginary class shall do for the other.

Here arises another contention, and thus we are kept chasing ghosts, while ghosts continue to multiply. "This is the problem, the inter-racial problem" arising from the assumption upon the part of one to dictate the right to and privilege of the other, whose legal rights and privileges are already equal in every sense to those who would thus dictate, that there would be resistance to this unwarranted assumption is a most natural consequence; it may be seen therefore that this inter-racial problem

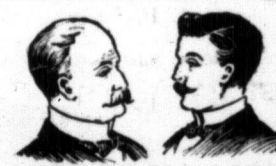
CANADA'S GREATEST FAIR.
