Sir,-

As requested in your letter of the 13th ult. I made an enquiry into the financial condition of the Mohawk Institute, being the first possible opportunity since my return from my vacation on the evening of the 3rd. inst.

Mrs. A.M. Boyce the Superintendent, is considerably in the dark regarding the assumption of financial obligations by the Department as she has had no communication regarding the matter from the New England Company.

At the present time she has \$22.01 in the current N.E. Co. account in the Bank of Montreal, a chaque for \$66.32 for sales of produce received yesterday and about \$200.00 of past due accounts, or in all about \$300.00 with which to meet her obligations.

There will be due on 15th inst. water rates amounting to about \$334.00 which must be paid to save the 20% discount allowed by the City, but as the Bank will allow her an overdraft of \$700.00 per month she can meet this and other sundry accounts.

Her expenditures naturally divide themselves under the three headings, (1) Fixed amounts, (2) Tradesmen's accounts (3) Contingent.
