SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even-numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district in which the land is situated. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at any Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an interlocking homesteader.

1. Duration.—(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

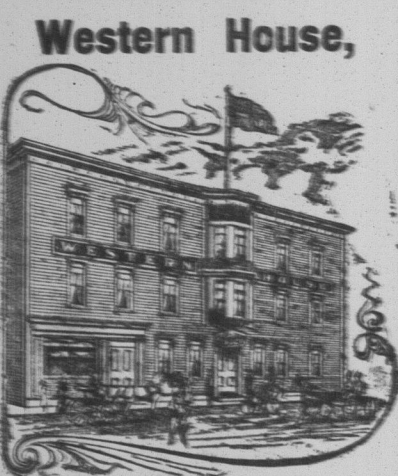
(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. He may also do so by living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intention.

The St. John Exhibition.

The space in the Industrial building is all taken up, extra accommodation is being provided for the enormously large entries of cattle, sheep, horses, poultry, etc. There will be a great display of agricultural and horticultural exhibits than at any previous Fair, and many wonderful new and interesting machines will be seen in operation in the Machinery Hall.

MOVING MACHINERY

One of the most interesting features will be the machinery hall where machines of many descriptions will be seen in motion. Gasoline engines both stationary and marine, brush and nail making machines, looms for manufacturing towel, and many others will be in operation. FAR AHEAD OF 1906

From the standpoint of entries received the success of the St. John exhibition is assured. Already the management report that in nearly all departments the entries are double what they were last year. The entries for cattle so far number more than 500 as against 280, to years ago. The sheep entries have just doubled and the horses nearly so. In poultry more than 1,000 entries have been received, and with the improved facilities the poultry house ought to be more fascinating than ever to visitors.

It is quite likely that the butter and cheese exhibits will attract more attention than usual. Special efforts have been made by the management to enhance the practical and educational value of this feature and, judging by the tone of the letters received, their efforts are being appreciated. Already seventy have signified their intention of sending exhibits.

LIVING REPTILES AT THE NATURAL HISTORY EXHIBIT

The Natural History exhibit will be one of the most interesting and instructive features of the approaching exhibition. The display will be the most comprehensive of its kind ever shown in St. John.

Valuable collections of gems and precious stones have been secured; all the best known minerals in their rough state will be shown, glass cases containing living reptiles will be exhibited, and specimens of plants, minerals and insects, collected by school children, also other interesting features will make this part of main building a place of great interest.

Useful Hints

In making cake, grease the tin with sweet lard rather than butter, and sift a little dry flour over it.

To remove ink stains from white cloth, heat a pint of sweet milk, soak goods in it and the stains will disappear.

Onions, if rinsed several times in fresh additions to boiling water before they are cooked, are much more digestible than if boiled in the ordinary manner.

The best way to freshen home-made bread so that it is as good as new is to dip the loaf in cold water, put it in a pan and bake it until it is heated through. Then wrap in a damp cloth, and when cold it is as good as when first baked.

A broom supporter made of spoons is a simple and convenient device. Screw two large empty spoons high up on the middle frame of a door, just far enough apart to allow the handle of the broom to slip in. The broom part rests on the spoons.

When getting ready for a week's general sweeping, if you take down your lace curtains and the portieres, shake them and lay them aside until you are through, then put them in place again, they will keep clean much longer.

Don't use soda when washing china ornaments with gilding, for soda will in time surely take off every vestige of gold from the pattern. Soap may be added to the water with impunity, and it will do the work of cleansing without roughening the hands of the operator, who, in cold weather especially, will find soda has a very bad effect on the skin.

Gilt picture frames frequently become discolored in hot weather, when flies are particularly aggressive. The white of an egg will be found most efficacious in removing the stains, a soft camel's hair brush being employed in applying it. Dull frames may be much improved by an application of onion water. A couple of good-sized onions should be boiled in sufficient water to cover them. This should then be strained off and brushed over the frame and into all the crevices.
