EYE WITNESSES TO RYDER MET HIS DEATH

WAS RYDER MET HIS DEATH

Some Important Evidence Brought Out at Last Evening's Session of Inquest Into Main Street Accident — Intoxication Theory Completely Refuted—Car Running Faster than Usual.

In the Temple of Honor Hall, Main street, last night, coroner Roberts resumed the inquiry into the death of James Alexander Ryder, who was killed by a street car on Main street on Tuesday evening, the 12th inst.

Edward H. Raymond, who was called by the coroner, related and explained to the coroner that Daniel Mullin, K. C., who was engaged, would not be able to be present, as he was being treated for a sore foot by Dr. Curran.

Mr. Raymond asked for a postponement. The coroner left the matter to the consideration of the jury, and they said that they did not wish an adjournment, so the inquiry was resumed.

Frederick R. Taylor appeared for the street railway company, and John A. Barry appeared for Benjamin Tutts, who was injured in the accident.

Mrs. Edith Klineade was the first witness and testified that she saw the accident. She resided at 444 Main street and left her home at 8:40 o'clock, and when she reached above drug store she saw two men on the curb stone. A car passed up Main street and another was coming down. One man was in his shirt and the other was in his coat.

When he looked up the car was right on him and he hit his head. He did not have hold of each other, for the taller man raised his hand as the car struck them. The shorter man did not get out of the car until it had stopped.

To the best of my knowledge," said Mrs. Klineade, "the men seemed to be talking about the accident and were not intoxicated."

Witness said she was on the scene of the accident when it happened. To Mr. McKay witness said she saw no man on the side of the street who was not on the curb stone.

To Mr. Courtney—When she saw the men step towards the track the car was opposite Wm. Turner's tailor shop on the corner of Street and Main—she said, "I saw the car had been going at a moderate speed it might have been stopped quickly if it had not been for the accident."

To Mr. Raymond—The two cars were almost abreast of each other at the time of the accident. Captain Tutts was nearest to the car at the time of the accident. The night was hazy but quite bright at the time of the accident. The car was going faster at the time than on ordinary occasions.
