THE LEGISLATURE.

FRANCISCO, March 13. Donald's Bill, to indemnify owners of meadows and other lands on Digbyquash River, was agreed to in Committee of the Whole.

Crawford introduced a Bill to alter the time of holding General Sessions of the Peace in King's County.

Lindsay, a Bill to enable the Board of School Trustees of Woodstock to hold property therein and issue debentures for payment of the same.

King resumed at eleven o'clock. He said the elections last year of Hatheway and Stevenson were on the School policy of the Government and said the School Law was the accepted law of the land, and accepted it.

He defended the economical administration of the Government and said the expenses were less than for the preceding three years. All the departments had been economically conducted.

The Commissioner of Works only followed the previous practice in over expenditure. It was a result of the fiscal year ending so long before the House met. He said the Government acted energetically in the Better Terms Delegation, and praised the aid received from Wedderburn.

He said they had been called an imbecile Government, but the Government that brought in the School Bill, the Mining Regulations and the River De Lepg Railway Bill was entitled to the confidence of the country.

He will resume after dinner. Hatheway said the Canadian Government paid the expenses of the Emigration Delegation.

He also stated that the person who wrote the News despatch about the assault, was possessed of a debauched heart, and would do anything to further the party he supported.

From Ottawa.

OTTAWA, March 12. Mr. Muirhead, who while here is the guest of Hon. P. Mitchell, leaves to-day for Fredericton.

While in England he was negotiating for the establishment of a line of passenger and freight steamers direct from Liverpool to Miramichi, which he hopes to see shortly placed in operation.

It is understood he has also secured the promise of a survey of the mouth of the Miramichi river and a new dredge to work upon the bar when spring opens.

The Five Free which mentions these matters, semi-officially states as probable that Muirhead will be a candidate for the Commons for Northumberland.

The Citizens publishes an extract of a private letter from Sir John A. McDonald to a friend in Chicago, in which the Halifax Chronicle's secret treaty box is referred to as follows:—

"I assure you that the story is altogether untrue; that it has no semblance nor shadow of truth; that the subject of the severance of Canada from the Mother Country has never been a matter of discussion between the Government of this and the Dominion, or between Lord DeGrey and myself."

It was precisely indisposed yesterday, he is to reside to-night at a meeting for forming a Trade Society.

Sir Wm. Logan has given \$1,800 in addition to \$2,000 previously given by him and Brother towards the endowment of a Chair of Geology in McGill University, Montreal.

It is stated that Principal Dawson will be the first Logan Professor.

Paris, March 11. Prince and Princess of Wales lunched to-day with Prince and Princess De Joinville, Duke D'Annam, Count and Countess of Paris and Duke De Nemours; afterwards received a visit from President Thiers accompanied by his staff.
