Co. was not the only hardware firm patronized by the Government. Q. Did they make any difference between the prices of the goods they had in stock and those they imported?

A. I know nothing about it only that they took advantage of their privilege of importing free. I had no knowledge of the fact that that privilege was being improperly used.

The privilege of introducing goods into the country duty free extended to any firm which imported on account of the railway. There were different firms in St. John which enjoyed this privilege.

I remember one, the firm of L. & P. Barpee. There were other firms in Halifax from which goods were purchased besides that of Fraser, Reynolds & Co. That firm was preferred.

In justice to Mr. Carvell, and as evidence of the fidelity of the charges against the late Ministers in connection with the hardware supplies for the railway, we give the following extracts from Mr. Carvell's testimony.

I complained specially of one of the charges made for goods supplied by this firm. That was for the purchase of iron rods in my report. I do not remember complaining of any other charges.

I told the store-keeper to compare the prices in Halifax, in particular Fraser, Reynolds & Co., with those in St. John and I found that the former were excessive.

My impression is that I said so to Mr. Fraser, and that he said the prices in Halifax were always higher than they were in St. John.

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Fraser, Reynolds & Co., according to this statement, would make good salesmen of a Government.

The changes of franchise and the addition of the rebate of duty to the profits, have yet to be investigated.

The prices were high, they were as low as those of any other Halifax house.

The inquiry seems to have been started chiefly for the purpose of trying to convict Dr. Tupper or Mr. Carvell of having abused the fat hardware profits, and in this the Government has completely failed.

Mr. Carvell began with an account of affairs when he took charge of the Intercolonial. There was no time to make a reorganization before the storms came on and forced a resort to the temporary expedient of giving employees salaries.
