12000 acres. The Reserve should
however include at least 9600 acres.
So as to have a small surplus rather
than a deficiency after allowing for
some indifferent land. -

Mr Archibald suggested 2 or 3
acres for each family. But, the object
being to afford these people such benefits
as they could enjoy from the cultivation
of land, the limits he proposes are too
circumscribed; and a suitable reply
to such a proposition will be founded
on the fact that it is not worth while to
purchase agricultural implements for
tilling such small quantities of land,
and that without proper implements
cultivation can not be successful -
The duty of assigning to these people land
whereon to grow their bread appears a
very plain one. -
