

5. Each company may form a separate "company fund" for such other expenses as shall be special and peculiar to each ; and such "company funds" may be governed and used in such manner as the officers, non-commissioned officers and privates of the respective companies may themselves determine.

6. The battalion fund shall consist of the government allowances for arms, armories, buildings, or other general services, (exclusive of drill allowances to the rank and file,) of all rents, subscriptions, fines, or other sources, and of contributions from all officers, non-commissioned officers and privates, on the following scale per annum, viz. :—

Privates, each .....	\$1 00
Corporals, " .....	1 50
Serjeants, " .....	2 00
Ensigns, " .....	4 00
Lieutenants " .....	6 00
Captains, " .....	12 00
Majors, " ..	24 00
Lieut.-Colonel .....	48 00
Honorary members .....	4 00

 of pay of officers  
 if officers help pay the amount received  
 by them for a small debt pay.*

The contributions of the officers shall be collected quarterly, and of the non-commissioned officers and men from their government allowance, (if any,) when the same shall be paid, and from such allowance only. Of the contributions of the latter, half the sums named shall, if collected as aforementioned, be transferred to their respective company funds, for separate company uses, as hereinbefore provided. In case the government make no allowance, then this clause shall be inoperative as affects rank and file.
