In these and all other Shipping Returns, the distinction is for the first time shewn between British vessels proper, and those owned in Canada, and in the foregoing summary it will be observed that the latter maintain a highly gratifying proportion.

I have also, for the first time, introduced statements shewing the number, tonnage and description of vessels engaged in the Coasting trade of the Dominion.

Another new and important feature is the statement of vessels sold to other countries, with description and value. These will also be found included in the Exports, thus adding legitimately to the volume of Canadian Trade.

In the Export Statements, the goods Produce and not Produce of Canada are shown in juxtaposition, the former practice of publishing them separately having been found inconvenient and confusing.

The following new statements have also been introduced, viz:—

Goods imported via St. Lawrence.

Goods exported do do

Goods exported through the United States in bond; and goods warehoused, ex-warehoused and remaining in warehouse.
