Victoria, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of *Great Britain* and *Ireland*,
QUEEN, Defender of the Faith, &c., &c., &c.

To all to whom these presents shall come.—GREETING:

Know ye, that amongst the Common Pleas enrolled in Our Court of Queen's Bench, for *Upper Canada*, (now the Province of *Ontario*), at *Toronto*, before the Honorable *William Buell Richards*, Chief Justice, and His Brethren the Justices of the said Court, the twenty-second day of February, A. D., 1869, in the thirty-second year of Our Reign, and on the five hundred and eighty-third Roll.

It it thus contained, *Victoria*, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of *Great Britain* and *Ireland*, QUEEN, Defender of the Faith.

To the Sheriff of the United Counties of *Frontenac*, *Lennox* and *Addington*—
"Greeting."

Whereas, *Jehiel D. Roblin* and *Samuel Huff*, junior, by their bond sealed with their seals made on the twenty-second day of November, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-fourth year of Our Reign, become bound to Our Sovereign Liege Lady the Queen in the sum of two hundred pounds of lawful money of the Province of *Canada*, payable at a day past, which sum they have not yet paid nor caused to be paid to us as we are informed.

And we being desirous to be satisfied the same with all the speed we can as is just.

Do command you that by good and lawful men of your counties, you give notice to the said *Jehiel D. Roblin* and *Samuel Huff*, junior, that they be and appear before the Justices of Our Court of Queen's Bench, at *Toronto*, on the first Saturday of Trinity Term instant, to shew cause if they can, why we should not have execution against them for the said sum
