An Act to amend the Act to Incorporate "*The Montreal Cemetery Company*," and for other purposes therein mentioned.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Act passed in the Session held in the tenth and eleventh years of Her Majesty's Reign, and entitled "*An Act to Incorporate the Montreal Cemetery Company*," and to change the name thereof; Be it therefore enacted, &c.,

Preamble.

That the corporate name of the said Company, be changed to "*The Spring Grove Cemetery Company*."

Name of Company.

10 II. And be enacted, That the Trustees of the said Company shall have power to make broken or irregular lots of less or more than one hundred superficial feet, and to charge for the same in proportion to the superficies thereof.

Power given to Trustees to make broken lots.

15 III. And be it enacted, That the fourteenth section, and the proviso of the fifteenth section of the said Act, shall be and are hereby repealed, and instead thereof, be it enacted, That in the event of the consecration of the said Cemetery or any part thereof, by any Religious denomination holding property therein, such act of consecration shall not be held to invest the said Religious body with any exclusive powers of jurisdiction either spiritual or temporal within the said Cemetery, saving the powers invested in such Religious bodies under the provisions contained in the twentieth section of said Act.

14th Section and Proviso of 15th Section of Act of Incorporation repealed.

Consecration not to give any religious body exclusive jurisdiction.

25 IV. And be it enacted, That no Religious denomination shall be entitled to elect one Trustee, unless the members of such Religious denomination are subscribers of twenty shares of the Capital Stock of the said Company.

As to right of electing Trustees.

V. And be it enacted, That the real estate of the said Company, and the lots or plots when conveyed by the Company to individual proprietors, shall be exempt from taxation or assessment

Exemption of real estate from taxation.
