16. All subscriptions of members due to the corporation under any by-law by any person bound thereby, and all other sums of money due to the corporation shall be paid to the treasurer thereof, and in default of payment may be recovered in any action 20 brought by him in the name of the corporation in any court of competent civil jurisdiction.
17. The meetings of the members of the council shall be open to all other members of the corporation, who may attend at the same, but who shall take no part in any proceedings thereat, and 25 minctes of the proceedings of all such mectings, and of $n^{\prime} 1$ general meetings of the corporation shall be entered in the register to be kept for that purpose by a person or persons appointed to keep the same, and the eutry shall be signed by the secretary, and such register shall be open at all reasonable hours to any member of 30 the corporation free of any charge, and also to all other persons, on payment of a fee of twenty cents to the officer having charge of the register:
