

parties concerned in the free admission of
the said goods; be it therefore enacted,

Free admission of certain goods made legal.

That the order for the free admission
of the said goods shall be deemed to have
been lawfully made, and all Officers or per-
sons concerned in making or in obeying
and carrying out the said order, are hereby
indemnified and saved harmless for what
they may have done in that behalf.

XXIX. And whereas emergencies may
arise for which, in order to maintain the
public faith, it may be necessary to provide
before the time of which the Provincial
Parliament can be assembled: Be it there-
fore enacted, That it shall be lawful for
the Governor in Council from time to time,
and whenever, in his opinion, it may be ne-
cessary, in order to enable the Consoli-
dated Revenue Fund to meet the charges
placed thereon, to increase the Duties of
Customs imposed by this Act, by adding
one tenth part, or ten per centum thereon,
to such Duties, by any Order in Council to
be made and published in the *Canada*
Gazette not less than three months before
it is to take effect, and in like manner and
after like notice, to take off such addi-
tional duty, and such additional duty shall
be payable accordingly on all goods im-
ported into this Province, or taken out of
Warehouse for consumption therein while
any such Order in Council shall be in
force.

Duties may in certain cases be increased by order in council.

XXX. And be it enacted, That this Act
shall have force and effect upon, from and
after the day of
in the present year one thousand eight
hundred and forty-nine, and not before.

Commencement of this Act.

XXXI. And be it enacted, That this
Act may be altered, amended or repealed
by any Act to be passed during the present
Session of the Provincial Parliament.

Act may be amended, &c. this Session.
