C A P. IX.

AN ORDINANCE

For regulating the currency of the province.

Preamble.

IN order to ascertain the value of the different coins usually passing in this pro-Il vince, and to prevent the same from being falsified or impaired, it is ordained and enacted by his excellency the captain general and governor in chief of this province, by and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council of the Province, that the following species of coins shall pass current throughout this province, at and the different coins after the rates herein after mentioned,—that is to fay,

Higher or lower edenominations in proportion.

And all the higher or lower denominations of the faid gold and filver coins shall pass current in their due proportions. And the faid species of coins or any of them, at the faid rates, shall be deemed a legal tender in payment of all debts whatever.

Any person convicted of impairing or diminish-ing any foreign gold coin passing current in the pro-· vince,

II. If any person whatsoever shall, after the publication of this ordinance, for lucre or gain, by any art, ways or means, clip wash, round, file, impair, diminish or falfify, or cause to be clipped, washed, rounded, filed, impaired, diminished or falsified any coin passing current in this province (other than the current coin of Great Britain, whereof the clipping, washing, rounding, filing, impairing, diminishing or falfifying, is declared to be high treason by the criminal laws of England, now in sorce in this province) such person offending
