jured by damp and making a requisition for oil, emery powder, whit ing and chamois leather toenable him to remove rust I beg to point out that you do not inform the Department whether or not those articles were sent to agent May. Meither is the Department able to judge from the correspondence whether his metay is to blame for a neglect of duty as regards there samples or whether the instruction which you no doubt sexthism with respect to them failed to reach kim. A reference to any letter to you of the 26th March 1884, paragraph 3" shows the intention of the Department with regard to the safe keeping of the samples as conveyed in the following extract therefrom Samples
