

The Cedar, the letter in question from the Department contains the general policy of the Department as regards the cutting of timber upon Indian Reserves, and in its general application there has been no trouble with other Agents in carrying it into effect. But circumstances have arisen and will occur, when modifications will be required and which can readily be made by a practical man.

The primary object of the Department for some years past, in Indians cutting timber has been with the view of leaving the land for cultivation, when practicable, and when the land
