

Ottawa, April 1st, 1915.

Sir,-

I am in receipt of your letter of the 30th ultimo, relative to the case of Flossie May Hill, an epileptic Indian woman, and in reply, I return herewith the papers which you submitted in connection with placing her in the Woodstock Asylum. Dr. Teeter should fill out page 4 of Form 145. The papers should then be sent to the authorities of the Woodstock Asylum, and the woman should be removed there as soon as possible.

Kindly inform the Department whether the relatives of Flossie May Hill are able to pay the cost, or any portion thereof, of her maintenance in the asylum. If they cannot bear the cost the fact should be stated, as it will be necessary to make payment from band funds.
