Re Edith Jackson's Money.

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 6th instant, in which you claim to be the legal guardian of Edith Jackson, a Songhees Indian girl at present a pupil of your School, who participates in the money paid by the Government of the Province of British Columbia to the heads of families of this band for their removal from the Songhees Reserve in this city under agreement with the Dominion Government.

In reply I beg to state that the money was paid into my hands for her, and, under advice from Frank Pedley, Esq., Deputy Superintendent General of Indian Affairs, the money has been placed in the Canadian Bank of Commerce Savings Bank in this city to her credit with the Superintendent General of Indian Affairs as trustee. The money will bear the current rate of interest.

Will you kindly convey this information to her and oblige? The amount is \$10,500.
