By-Law No. 20 of 1912

A By-law to set apart portions of certain streets and highways in the Police Village of Granton for sidewalks. 3. Edw. 7th, Chap. 19, Sec. 637, Sub-Sec. 3.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of Biddulph, and it is hereby enacted, as follows:

1.—That eight feet on the east and west sides of Main street from Head street on the north of the survey of the Village of Granton to Huron street on the south of the survey of the Village of Awmick, and on the south side of Head street to the westerly limit of the survey of King street and on the north and south sides of Ann street to the westerly limit of said King street, and on the south side of John street in the survey of the said Village of Awmick to the westerly limit of village let "K" on said John street, and on the north and south sides of Isabella street to the easterly limit of the survey of Queen street in the said Village of Granton, and on the north side of what is termed Station street, in said Village of Granton, to the said easterly limit of the said Queen street; and that eight feet of the foregoing described streets are hereby set apart for foot-paths or sidewalks.

2.—That no person shall ride, drive, lead or back any horse or other animal, or drive any wagon, carriage (except a baby's carriage), bicycle, tri-cycle or other vehicle of any kind, in or along any of the said foot-paths or sidewalks in the said Police Village of Granton or in the said survey of the said Village of Awmick, except in the using of a lawful crossing to enter any premises, as provided in the next following section. Nor shall any person fence or enclose any of the aforesaid streets.

3.—Any owner or occupier of any house, building or lot within said Police Village of Granton, including the survey of the said Village of Awmick, who shall require to cross any foot-bath or sidewalk, with any animal or vehicle of any description, shall construct across the drain or watercourse opposite the place of entry into his premises, a good and sufficient bridge or culvert, with plank, stone or cement, so constructed as not to obstruct such drain or watercourse, and shall also place a piece of timber, stone or cement along the edge of each side of the foot-path or sidewalk so as to prevent any injury to the same, in crossing.

4.—That the owner of such premises shall be held liable for any
