PROF. W. H. PICKERING'S PURSUIT OF THE ERRATIC SATELLITE

for Locating Her Once by Photography Time-His Work in South Americagraphing Heavenly Bodies.-His "Atlas

An astronomical article published but a short time ago made this statement: "Saturn has at least eight satellites. A ninth was discovered photographically in 1890 at the Arequipa (Peru) station of the Harvard University observatory, but this discovery still lecks confirmation." However, Professor William H. Pickering, who originally made the find, has now proved beyond cavil the existence of the ninth satellite. Saturn, the ancient divinity of the Greeks and Romans, had numerous relatives, and as fast as astronomers relatives, and as fast as astronomers have discovered new satellites of the planet Saturn they have named th

for brothers or sisters or other kins-folk of the mythical god of the ancients. The minth satellite was named Phoebe by Professor Pickering in honor of one of Saturn's sisters. The eight other members of the family are Jenetus Hyperion Technique. are Japetus, Hyperion, Tethys, Dione, Titan, Engalade, Mimas and

one traits which distinguish her as just about the most cratic attache of a planet that ever came under an astronomer's telescope. Professor l'ickering, who has recently mapped to the most and withing a state of the most and withing a state. out the moon and published an atlas by which one can study the geography of the satellite of Mother Earth, has learned that Phoebe plays a game of "peekaboo" with inquisitive observers from this planet. Not only so, but contrary to the regulations of Saturn's numerous family she re-volves backward. To begin with, Phoebe is a very small sphere, her diameter being only about 200 miles, as calculated by Professor Pickering. That is minute in comparison with the earth's 8,000 miles and with the 73,000 miles diameter of Saturn himself. It is said that Hympion can't is said that Hympion self. It is said that Hyperion, could that satellite be seen from Saturn, would look about as large as Jupiter does to observers on the earth. But Phoebe would look only about But Phoebe would look only about the size of a star of the fifth or sixth magnitude. No resident of earth has seen Miss Phoebe with the naked eye or even directly through the tele-scope. Professor Pickering has never seen her except as a speck on a photographic plate, and even then it required several photographers. required several photographers, lo-cating her at different attitudes of her eccentric orbit, to prove that what was seen was not simple a speck of dust in the telescope.

Phoebe was discovered by Professor Pickering through the twenty-four inch Bruce telescope of the Harvard observatory at Arequipa, Peru, March 14, 1899. The professor had been looking for her for eleven years. Several photographs were taken and observations made as to her charac-teristics when suddenly she disap-peared, and disappeared so completepeared, and disappeared so completely as to make the astronomer wonder whether he had ever discovered her at all. But at length she was located again, and it was then found that her habit of going backward accounted for her success in fooling the curtous star gazers. Various explanations are offered for this retrograde motion. One is that Phoebe was originally a comet which was contined.

tions star gazers. Various explanations are offered for this retrograde motion. One is that Phoebe was originally a comet which was captured by Saturn. In such case the comet by passing on one side of Saturn would have given direct motion to the resulting satellite or on the other retrograde.

Professor Pickering is an expert in the business of photographing the heavenly bodies. He can tell when it snows in Mars, and, as for the moon, he has that mapped out as accurately as a tract cut up into town lots. His "Atlas of the Moon" tells everything about the orb of night from its origin, some hundreds of millions of years ago, to its present day vegetation and snow. Professor Pickering is forty-six years old. He is a graduate of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. When he was twenty he assisted in the observations made in Colorado of the total sclipse of 1878. He became connected with the Harvard observatory in 1887. In connection with his astronomical work Professor Pickering has climbed some tall mountains. He has ascended over 100 peaks, including El Misti, in Peru, which soars to an altitude of 19,400 feet. The Arequips Station is located over 8,000 feet above sea level, and it has been found that magnifying powers can be used there two or three times as high as in Canada.


