

TORONTO, ONT.—Darling & Pearson, architects, are asking for tenders up to 26th inst. for erection of a convocation hall in Queen's Park for the University of Toronto.—The T. Milburn Co. have purchased about 120 feet of property on south side of Queen street, near Bathurst street, on which they will erect a factory and storage warehouse.—Plans of a waterworks system to be constructed at Grimsby, Ont., are on view at the office of Wills Chipman, C. E., this city. Tenders close 26th inst.—A vacant lot on the corner of College street and Delaware avenue has just changed hands, and it is said that the purchaser will build stores and dwellings thereon.—Plans for construction of 15,000 lineal feet of cast iron water mains for the village of Creemore, Ont., may be seen at the office of John Galt, the chief engineer, this city. Tenders close 8 p. m. on Monday next.—The Gale Manufacturing Co. have bought a site near corner of Spadina ave. and Wellington place on which they intend to erect a four-storey building costing about \$75,000.—John Small, Collector of Customs, will receive tenders up to 15th inst. for construction of 10 trucks for the examining warehouse.—R. J. Fleming, Assessment Commissioner, has asked the Civic Property Committee for a grant of \$60,000 for new freight sheds on the east side of the city's wharf at Harbor Square.—It is stated that the Grand Trunk Railway will build a new round house on water lots at the foot of Spadina avenue which are now being filled in.—J. Davis, architect, 77 Adelaide street east, wants separate tenders for erection of a brick house and stable.—The Property Committee of the Board of Education will ask for tenders immediate-
