mately surrendering Albania to Serbia. His hatred of the Catholics is based upon the vigorous opposi-tion which the Catholic mountain tribac tribes interposed to his invasion. They refused to recognize his so-called government and in retalia-tion he has attacked the Catholic clergy, holding them responsible for the attitude of the Catholic tribes.
