THE GRAIN GROWERS' GUIDE through the purchase of stamps of small denominations, which can be carried in books issued for the purpose and accumulated until a sufficient amount has been paid to purchase a war saving certificate of say five dollars, bearing interest at the rate of four per cent. per annum, the purchase price payable at maturity. The government will re-deem these war savings' certificates at any time before maturity upon request of the holder allowing interest at a less rate than four per cent. An active cam-paign to bring the value of these war saving certificates to the attention of the people of the country will im-mediately be carried out.
