

### DOMINION FINANCES

The financial statement of the Dominion covering the first four months of the fiscal year, shows a falling off of nearly 50 per cent. in revenue from customs duties, the figures for the 1920 period being \$69,773,478, and for the corresponding months of the present year, \$35,037,891. The estimate of the finance minister as given to the Parliament, was for a revenue from customs duties amounting to \$135,000,000. Based upon the actual receipts to July 15 the customs revenue will total some \$30,000,000 short ofthis figure, and twice as far below last year's receipt with little prospect of loss being offset by increased income from other sources, such, for example, as the sales tax. Despite the heavy decline in customs revenue, the total receipts from all sources for the four months period amounted to \$141,308,520, or within four millions of the total for the first four months of last year. This, however, is largely due to the unusual increase in the income tax returns owing to the fact that the taxes for 1919 and 1920 are both being collected this year. Upon the whole, the financial situation is most unsatisfactory, and points the way to the practice of greater economy on the part of the government than it has thus far displayed.

The tax rate of 56 mills on the dollar which was struck by the Town Council at a special meetting on Wednesday of last week, is not only the highest in the history of the town but is, we believe, not exceeded by any other place in Bruce County. In comparison with the tax rate of 41 mills for last year, the new rate is some humdigger, and when it comes around the time for rendering unto Caeser the citizens will run a real danger of getting round-shouldered lugging the tribute to the Town Hall. The soaring of the tax rate to such dizzy heights here is almost entirely due to the increase in the County and General Purpose Rate and the enormous extra cost in the running of the High School here caused by the boost in teachers' salaries at a time when the workingman's wages are coming down, together with other incidental expenses at the school. As the Town Council, however, has no control over either the School or County Rates, it can't be blamed for these items, the only part the local statesmen contribute to the tax increase being in the General Purpose Rate, which, owing to the expensive washout on Rudolph's hill, and the building operations and land purchase at the Exhibition Grounds, have sent ooilioio iliooooloioo nnn ufamthedrrithis up considerably.
