Late Duke of Argyll's Marriage Was One Between Kindred Souls

"Eh, Mon, but it's a proud leddy the Queen in this day!" So, according to tradition, spoke a canny Scots dame on that March day in 1871 when the Princess Louise became the bride of the Marquis of Lorne. It well illustrates the regard, amounting almost to reverence, which loyal Scots have for the greatest of all the Caledonian clans. What is it, that makes the daughter of the British sovereign compared with the heir of the Campbells?

It would be little, if any, exaggeration to say that the Campbells are the greatest family in the United Kingdom. John Douglas Sutherland Campbell, the son-in-law of Queen Victoria, who died the other day, was only the ninth Duke of Argyll, with a title little more than two centuries old. But as Baron Campbell, Earl of Argyll, Baron of Lorne and what not, his dignities far antedated the Columbian discovery of America.

Handsome, accomplished and ambitious, young Lorne was, however, in a measure overshadowed by the fame of his father and by the rank of his wife. He was "the husband of Princess Louise." But he, after all, made a place for himself in the world through sheer force of personality. For five years he was Governor-General of Canada, and the charm of the vice-regal court under his administration is still gratefully remembered.

Some years ago he engaged in another unusual enterprise, which was nothing less than the recovery of treasure from the wreck of one of the galleons of the Spanish Invincible Armada.
