## CASEY AGAIN ON THE RACK

Dr. Macarthur Swears to Two Complaints

hich Sun People Declare Are in Revenge for Roast Handed.

After being detained by the police at the town station yesterday afternoon for four hours Casey Moran, the Sun reporter who on the day previous had held long range conversation with the quarantined inhabitants of Dog Island, was discharged by order of Major Wood.

This morning, however, Medical Health Officer Macarthur went before Magistrate Starnes and swore to two complaints against Moran, one being that on the 5th day of June he did expose himself to infection from smallpox at the quarantine station by the passengers of the Whitehorse, contrary to hapter 19 of the consolidated orlinances of the Northwest Territores, while the second charge is with left quarantined premises nt the consent of the medical health officer.
