Toronto, March 13 .- P. H. Bowyer. East Kent, in the Legislature to-day, introduced a bill to amend the Liquor License Act. At present only a license holder or his employes are liable to a penalty for selling, giving or supply-ing liquor to minors. The amendment is designed to cover all persons, ex-cepting parents, guardians or physi-

cians.

Another clause is amended, making it necessary for any club under a Dominion charter and desiring a license to obtain same from the Provincial Secretary instead of from the local License Commissioners, as at present.
